

An evening of drama! Not for the faint-hearted!

Traditionally thought of as an instrument of the church and 'The Light', the organ here shows a different face: tonight's unusual programme features works inspired by mythology, demons, and dark, disturbed and troubled imagination...

Faust takes center-stage in Petr Eben's epic 9-movement work that closely follows Goethe's narrative. A kaleidoscope of sound from the ethereal to the bizarre vividly depicts everything... Faust's scientific experiments to conjure up the Devil, the debauched revelry of the drunken students, the bitter loneliness and remorse of Gretchen sitting at her Spinning Wheel, the Evil Spirit's taunts in the cathedral, the dancing mob and terrifying destruction in Walpurgisnacht. Good finally overpowers evil in the final movement in which the angels bring salvation "to those who have striv'n upwards".

Two mythical figures are also present in the programme - The Will o'the Wisp and Undine - in beautiful studies by Vierne and the Swiss organist Marcus Braun who has long been fascinated by the myth of Ondine - salvation through love.



American organist and composer William Albright's Last Rites creates an experience of sound at once compelling and disturbing.

Henry James' classic, dark, novel "The Turn of the Screw" inspired Jean Guillou to write one of his extended musical commentaries, a work representing "a childhood at the same time angelic and fiendish - creating compulsions, storms and crises" ...

Whilst in no way associating himself with dark forces, the distinguished virtuoso D'Arcy Trinkwon acts as our host us on this journey through unusual musical worlds and vistas. Renowned for the passionate musicianship, explosive virtuosity, and colour of his interpretations, the magic he brings to the organ has earned him the nickname "the Nureyev of the organ" ... Particularly acclaimed for his affinity with Romantic and symphonic works, he has also given the British premier of numerous works - most recently Messiaen's recently discovered Prélude. He gave the Scottish premier of Faust in Edinburgh in 1992.
